



Yvonne B. Burke, Supervisor of the 2nd District, Los Angeles County, lives in the 4th District in Marina del Rey (The Great Prix Tender, L.A. Times, 08/22/97, Part E) even though the County Charter (Art. II, Sec. 4) compels supervisors to "reside in the district of incumbency." Subpoena, default, repeal, seal or jurisdiction of courts have no meaning for this career, civil attorney. Despite Article VI, Sec. 21 County Counsel refused to defend her in Writ of Mandate (#BSO23174, Sup. Court: Lofton v. Burke) filed to make her function. With the powers (Art. III, Sec. 10 County Charter) granted supervisors: Mrs. Burke cannot deprive her constituent of settlement of a civil victory (#895188, Sup. Court: Lofton v School Board LAUSD) without first indicting herself as being without an ability to reason, devoid of any degree of discretion and admitting she never intended to honor the trust the position *demands*. Therefore plaintiffs/constituents have every right to the Order of Judgment on Peremptory Writ (#BSO23174) from The Honorable David P. Yaffe, Superior Court, L.A. 111 North Hill Street-Department 86, Los Angeles, CA 90012, *immediately*, to force settlement in the long-pending civil victory (#895188).
